



Biography for Dr. Paul E. Chapman

Paul E. Chapman, Ph.D., is an associate professor of leadership studies in the College of Human Resources and Education at West Virginia University. His main research interest is public school leadership. He is also engaged in research on character education, 21st century teaching, learning, and leadership, computer mediated communication as a pedagogical tool, organizational theory as it applies to school leadership, and teaching techniques for the enhancement of student achievement. Dr. Chapman has published research on the building blocks for preparing good educational leaders; improving retention rates in biochemistry; cohort culture; and educational administration student perceptions of instructional delivery formats. He has been invited to speak and present both nationally and internationally at places like the 13th Annual Character Education Conference, Washington D. C., Exeter College, University of Oxford, England, and the College of Science, Technology, and Agriculture of Trinidad and Tobago. Dr. Chapman is a talented musician and avid fly fisherman.
